## What is Supported Employment?

Supported Employment is a concept, which enables people with disabilities to be employed in paid jobs in the open labour market.

On the job training and individualised long term support are key elements of supported employment.

## The Beneficiaries of Supported Employment?

All people with disability interested in employment in the open labour market.

Employers receive backup support of a professional service, they gain a valuable employee and they can introduce an equal opportunities policy within the organisation.

The wider community benefits through the individuals personal and monetary input into local economy.
